7. ACCOMODATION

Hotel accommodation is not covered and must be paid separately in advance. Due to a generous offer from the Hotel Lepenski Vir, all accommodation and meals from cocktails dinner on Tuesday 28th June to lunch on Friday 1st July are included for **ONLY 129** €.

For additional nights out with the conference dates, rooms can be booked on per night basis for 43 €.

Hotel Lepenski Vir is located on the slopes above Donji Milanovac 161 meters above sea level. It has the capacity of 450 beds in single, double rooms and apartments, restaurant with 500 seats, bar, National restaurant, salon, congressional hall. The hotel also has a swimming pool with all of the additional contents such as gym, sauna, etc.

8. HOW TO GET TO DJERDAP NATIONAL PARK

We strongly urge you to make your travel plans in order to ARRIVE in Belgrade by 3pm on Tuesday 28th and to DEPART after 3pm on Friday 1st, as this will optimise your time at conference and allow for more efficient transfers and shuttles to and from the National Park. The transfer time to the national park is approximately 3 hours. Morning departures on Friday 1st will require VERY EARLY transfer times.



Management office of Djerdap National Park is located in Donji Milanovac. Donji Milanovac is situated in the Majdanpek municipality. It is located on the right bank of Lake Djerdap on the River Danube. Since its founding, Donji Milanovac has moved 3 times.

In 1691 the whole settlement moved to the Danube island of Porec, a place that kept inhabitants out of reach of the Turkish army.

In 1832 the settlement moved back to mainland. The new formed town was the first in Serbia to be built by plans, which were the work of Stefan Stefanovic Tenka, President of Serbian Government. The name Porec was changed to Milanovac in honour of Prince Milan Obrenovic.

The final move to another place occured in 1971. Donji Milanovac was moved 3 km up the river due to building of a hydroelectric power plant "Djerdap I" and rising of the River Danube level caused by that.

Nowadays, Donji Milanovac, settled in the middle of Djerdap National Park, is a great tourist destination, especially for those who enjoy beauties of nature.

One main road pass through the Majdanpek municipality M 25-1 (Požarevac – Veliko Gradište – Golubac – Donji Milanovac) linking it with the E 75 (highway Belgrade – Niš). Donji Milanovac is 197 km far away from Belgrade.

9. DJERDAP NATIONAL PARK

Djerdap National Park is located in the southeastern part of Europe, in the southeast of Serbia, on the border with Romania. The total area of the National Park is 63.608ha. The main attraction of this area is the grandiose Djerdap gorge through which river Danube flows and is the hone of the famous Iron Gates over the Danube for which the park is named,. The park stretches about 100 km of the Danube from Golubac to Kladovo and includes a narrow wooden strip, the width of 2-8 km along the Danube River, which rises from 50-800 m above sea level. A specific local historic development, a favorable climate, a complex network of cliffs and canyons, distinguish Djerdap as a unique European reservation of tertiary flora and fauna.

Here you can see lynx, wolf, jackal ...The basic feature of the Djerdap National Park is a large forested area, about 64% of the territory is covered with forests. The permanent presence of humans in this region is witnessed by numerous archaeological sites and cultural-historical monuments, such as Lepenski Vir, Tabula Traiana, Golubacki grad, Diana, etc..

10. EXCURSIONS

1. Option: Veliki Strbac

The total track length: 9km

The e special landscape feature of the Veliki and Mali Strbac is one of the scientifically most interesting and most attractive touristic places in the Djerdap National Park. Rarely found in areas where a relatively small area combines so many natural values as well as cultural and historical sites.

In this area of special natural value there are more interesting views, among which are the most important peaks of the Veliki (768 m. above sea level) and Mali Strbac (626 m. above sea level).

Duration of tour in bus: 2 hours

Hiking: 6 hours

Level of difficulty: demanding

Recommendation: Take field clothes and water.

2. Option: Kovilovo-Rajko's cave

Kovilovo is one of the most attractive places of the National Park Đerdap. From here there is a view over the Donji Milanovac.

Rajko's cave is located 2.5 km from the center of Majdanpek.

It was named after Rajko which according to the legend, robbed a treasure of the Turkish caravans and hid it in a cave. The total length of the cave is 2,304 m. The cave is rich in stalactites, stalagmites, and cave pillars.

Duration of tour in bus: 2 hours

Hiking: 1.5 hours Level of difficulty: easy

Recommendation: Take field clothes and water.

3. Option: Vratna-Rajačke pimnice

Vratna village was named for its natural stone bridges which are located in a rural district, also the name of the river flowing under them, as well as the Monastery, which dates from the 14th century.

The first records of settlements are found in the Turkish census from 1530. Rajačke pimnice is a unique attraction, that is a small city of wine. Once Rajačke pimnice produced more than 400 wagons of grape. This place is known for its high quality wines and nice ambience.

Duration of tour in bus: 2 hours

Hiking: 1.5 hours

Level of difficulty: easy

Recommendation: Take field clothes and water.

4. Option: Cruising down the Danube through Kazan to Trajan's Plaque

This part of the Danube, many consider the most attractive throughout its course. Here, the Danube is the deepest and narrowest. Trajan's Plaque can be seen only from the water. This monument dates from the year 100, from the time of Trajan's expedition against the Dacians. The monument is made of vertical boards carved in stone. Its length is 3.20 m high and 1.80 m wide. It is decorated with two dolphins, six petals roses and an eagle with outstretched wings. On the Romanian coast you can see the King Decebal, which was carved in the rock. This sculpture is 40 feet high and is the largest sculpture in the rock in Europe.

Cruising: 2 hours Level of difficulty: easy
